# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Prime purchase order awards from July 1, 2010, to June 30, 2015, were examined. The industries included construction services, construction-related services, engineering and professional services, and materials, commodities and services. The subcontract analysis was limited to construction prime purchase orders.

# What M/WBE Remedies Will There Be at the Prime Contract Level?

<u>Incentive Credits</u> Ten percent of the evaluation points assigned to each solicitation for engineering and professional services prime purchase orders will be assigned to the M/WBE groups that were found to have a disparity.

**Bid Discounts** A ten percent bid discount will be applied to bids submitted by the M/WBE groups that had a disparity on construction, construction-related, and materials, commodities and services prime purchase orders. The maximum discount will not exceed \$50,000 and will only apply to bids valued up to \$500,000.

The groups that are eligible for the incentive credits or bid discount are described in the table below.

## What are the M/WBE Subcontract Remedies?

<u>Construction Subcontracting Goals</u> A construction subcontracting goal will be set for African Americans, Asian-Indian Americans, and Caucasian Females. The M/WBE subcontract goal applies to construction contracts where the engineer's estimate is valued at or above \$150,000. The construction subcontract goals will be based on each group's availability. The availability for African Americans is 18.23%, 1.99% for Asian-Indian Americans, and 14.81% for Caucasian Female construction subcontractors.

<u>Evidence of Goal Attainment at Bid Opening</u> Prime contractors will be required to submit evidence of M/WBE goal attainment at the time of bid opening. Each goal must be met with one or more certified businesses that can provide a commercially useful function or an approved good faith effort document.

<u>Substitution of Listed M/WBE Subcontractors</u> MSD's Interim Supplier Diversity Policy will include specific standards for M/WBE subcontractor substitution.

To be counted toward the contract goal, the M/WBE must perform a distinct and commercially useful scope of work for which it has the skill and expertise. The contractor must also perform the work with its own forces and manage and supervise the work.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What Policy Changes were Recommended in the Disparity Study?

#### Implement a Small Local Business Enterprise Program

A Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) Program to improve access to MSD contracts for small businesses within the market area. A 15% SLBE goal on construction, construction-related, engineering and professional services, and materials, commodities, and services purchase orders should be established to increase the participation of SLBEs.

The SLBE Program should include a small purchases rotation component for construction, construction-related services, engineering and professional services, and materials, commodities, and services prime purchase orders that do not exceed \$20,000.

Community Benefits Program A Community Benefits Program (CBP) to mitigate the impact on service area communities from the rehabilitation of MSD's sewer system. The CBP will provide employment, contracting, education, and community improvements for the service areas impacted by MSD's sewer system rehabilitation projects. The CBP should also include eco-friendly programs and policies that reduce environmental impacts on MSD's service areas through a community grant program.

<u>Modify Change Order Requirements</u> Change orders should not exceed 15% of the original cost of the contract. If the cost exceeds 15% the new task or scope would be awarded through MSD's competitive solicitation process.

MSD should expand its technical assistance offerings
to include a sponsored mentor protégé program and
to promote the services offered through federal
technical assistance programs, including the U.S.
Small Business Administration's SCORE Program,
Small Business Development Centers, and Women
Business Centers
